Emma is a passionate advocate for the history and future of folk music in Australia.

She has performed in Australia and abroad in a number of bands (cloud street, The Wish List, The Ceilidh Clan, Emma Nixon and Tony Vandermeer, Iontach, and FRED SMITH).

She is also deeply committed to sharing folk music with young people, establishing the Queensland Youth Folk Orchestra, Folkaphonic (at Festivals) and Junior Fiddle Club.

It is her highly inclusive approach to music - to sharing the love of it and the skills for playing it - that makes Emma's contribution so remarkable. Both through private tuition and her teaching at Scottish fiddle music camps she has encouraged young and old musicians to engage in a variety of folk music.
